ADMISSIONS

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Honorslevel grade 912 students of typical high school age are eligible to apply.

Students should have sedfscipline, motivation and available time to complete college coursework.

Minimum precollegeadmission requirements:

- 1. Students must have a 3.0 grade point average in high school core academic subjects.
- 2. Typically, juniors and seniors enroll but freshmen and sophomores with agrade reading and writing skills may be admitted. A writing sampletest score may be required for younger students.
